Aleksander Voronenko, Head, Research Center for SCO and APRKhabarovsk State University of Economics and Law

Aleksandr graduated from Khabarovsk State University of Economics and Law in 2007, worked as researcher at the Economic Research Institute Far Eastern Branch of Russian Academy of Science in 2007-2009 and as a consultant of the Interregional Association of Economic Interaction «Far East and Transbaikalia» in 2007-2015. He started as a scholar at the Far Eastern Institute of State Service under the president of Russian Federation in 2015 and earned his PhD. at the Khabarovsk State University of Economics and Law in 2016. Before obtaining his current position as the head of the Research Center for Shanghai Cooperation Organization and Asia-Pacific Region, Khabarovsk State University of Economics and Law in 2018, he served the same institution in the role of senior adviser for two years. He has authored more than 20 scientific articles and 3 external-economic digests focusing on the socio-economic development of the Russian Far East. He is one of the initiators and a member of the Working Group «Bering Pacific Arctic Council». The Working Group was created during the 2019 Russian American Pacific Partnership (RAPP) meeting in Khabarovsk. Its main goal is to explore the possibility and necessity of the establishment of the bi-national Bering Pacific Arctic Council and to develop its draft structure and statute.
